Privacy Policy

The Canadian Baton Twirling Federation (CBTF) recognizes your right to privacy and is strongly committed to protecting the privacy of all visitors to our web site. Information of a Non-Personal Nature

As a general policy, with the exception of IP addresses, no personal information is automatically collected from visitors to the CBTF's web site. We may use personal information you provide to us for other fully disclosed purposes to the extent such use by us is explained to you when the information is voluntarily and knowingly provided to us. We will not give, sell, rent, or loan any of your personal information to any unrelated third party unless you have authorized us to do so.

Some services of the CBTF web site are available to web site members only. To become a member of the CBTF web site, you must be a member of the Canadian Baton Twirling Federation. We may use personal information you have provided on your CBTF membership application to create your CBTF web site account.

CBTF reserves the right to access and/or disclose personal information where required to comply with applicable laws or lawful government requests or, in our reasonable opinion, to operate our web site properly and securely, or to protect CBTF or other visitors to this web site.
